Universe	Spanish residents of both sexes between 15 and 29 years.
Sample size	I,466 interviews

Sampling points	184 boroughs and 47 provinces
Sampling procedure	Multi-stage, stratified into clusters, with selection of the primary sampling units (Boroughs) and the secondary units (sections) with probability proportional to their size, and the final units (individual) through random routes and sex and age groups. The strata were formed by the intersection of the 17 Autonomous Regions with the habitat size, divided into 7 categories: less than or 2,000 inhabitants; from 2,001 to 10,000; from 10,001 to 50,000; from 50,001 to 100,000; from 100,001 to 400,000; from 400,001 to 1,000,000, and more than 1,000,000 inhabitants. The questionnaires were applied by means of personal interviews at the targets' homes.
Sample error	In a simple random sample, with a reliability level of 95.5% (two sigma) and $P = Q$ , the actual sample error is ±2.61 %.
